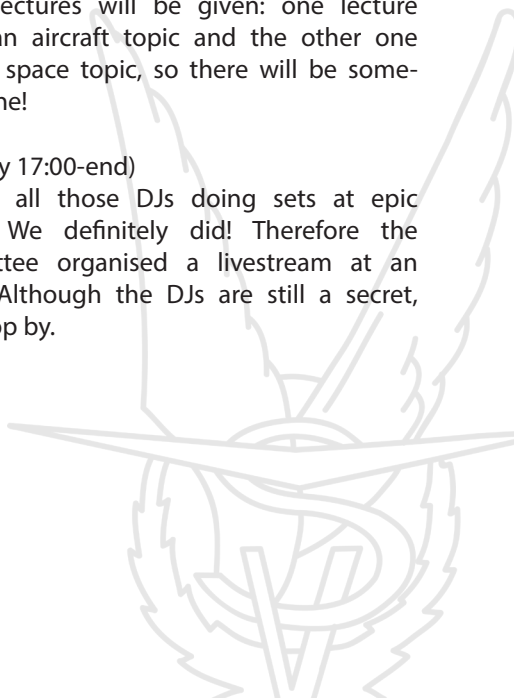


### Guest Lectures (Saturday 14:30-16:00)

### Airbase (Saturday 17:00-end)

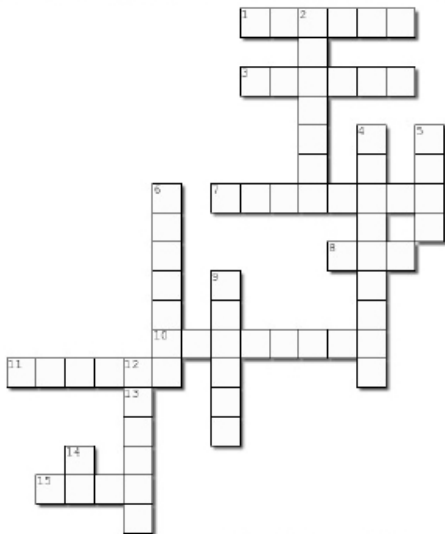

The committees will introduce themselves on the following pages. You can join a committee in the beginning of each academic year. There are four types of committees: freshmen committees, second year committees, senior committees which you can join after your second year and mixed committees which you can join as a freshmen. During the Freshmen Weekend, it will be made clear how you can join a committee and what the committee will bring you!

## Aerospace Diversity Day (Senior)

Hi everyone, we are the Aerospace Diversity Day committee! Aerospace Diversity Day is a symposium held each year to highlight diversity in the aerospace industry. With workshops, speakers, a panel discussion and a network event, it is a unique opportunity to ask questions and learn about problems and solutions regarding diversity. To us, diversity in the aerospace industry is a topic of great importance, and we want to inspire you to discuss and question the status quo. Did you know that in the aviation industry, 26% of air traffic controllers, 18% of flight planners and only 9% of the engineers are female? This year, unfortunately the symposium could not take place, however we did have some great things lined up. For example, Sandra Bour Schaeffer, the CEO of Airbus UpNext, was one of our speakers. Instead of the symposium, we organised an online event. Here staff members of our faculty shared their experiences regarding diversity within aerospace, and you can find it on the VSV Youtube.

This online party will take place at the end of your freshmen weekend, where you will party online with fellow freshmen, mentors and other students from TU Delft. The committee is a very good learning experience as you have a lot of responsibility during the party and you get a lot of creative freedom to organize your perfect party. AkCie (second year)

The AkCie is THE activity committee of the VSV. It is a 2nd year committee consisting of 7-8 members.

From parties to big events like the Belgian Beer Drink and the Top Gun (Gun Top) drink, the AkCie does it all. There have been many different events organized over the years, these include a Ferrari Karting Event, Beer Garden, Pubcrawl, Casino Night and many more!

The main events the AkCie organizes are the Top Gun Drink, the Belgian Beer Drink and the Board Reveal Party.

The Top Gun Drink stems from an age old VSV tradition to watch the best aviation movie ever made: Top Gun (Gun Top)! This viewing usually takes place in the main lecture hall, followed by an awesome party in the Atmosfeer (Hoogh)!

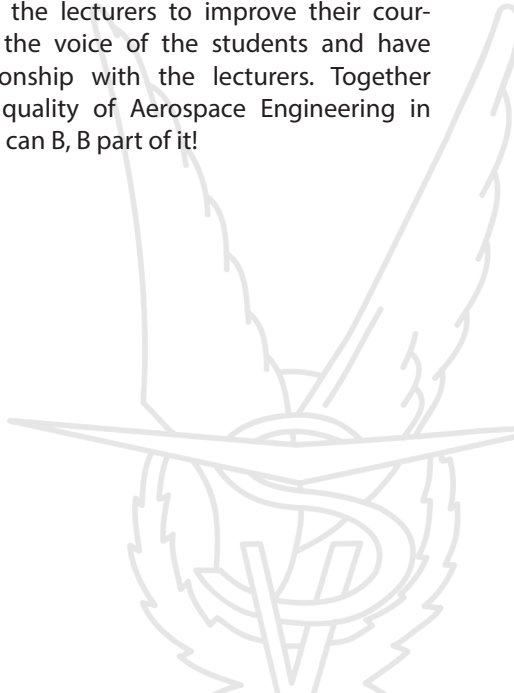

## RVD (senior)

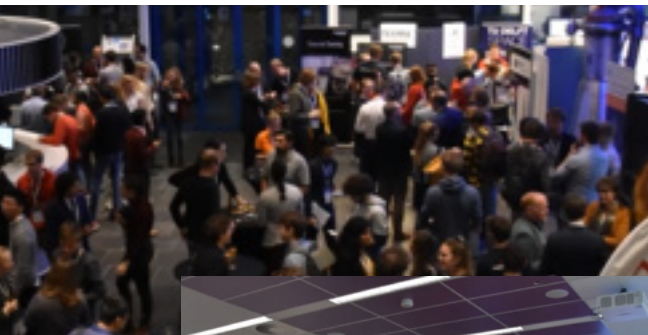
